

Pay-for-Reporting (P4R) Metrics Crosswalk

The following tables identify the current list of P4R metrics, as compared to the original list per the Project Toolkit.

- **Table I** shows the current P4R metrics list, target provider type, and associated projects. P4R metrics are now limited to the seven items listed in Table I.
- **Table II** shows the outdated, original P4R metric list from the Project Toolkit.

The state streamlined the original P4R metrics list substantially from what is in the Project Toolkit. Please note that the intent of many of the items removed from the formal P4R metrics list will be captured through other reporting mechanisms (e.g. semi-annual reports, maintenance of the partnering provider roster). Metrics that remained in the list were refined and framed to capture valuable information at the participating provider site/location level.

The current P4R metric list (Table I) is considered final, with the exception of minor refinements that may be made after the conclusion of P4R metric pre-testing with providers (e.g. language used for question/response).
